**Genesis 3:9**

- Stewardship is “God’s plan to fulfill my life.”
  - Fulfill – that which completes (Col. 2:9).
  - This principle is God’s plan to cause His will to produce an abundance.
  - Purpose: a character building, principle.
  - Goal: to super abound and meet the needs of others.
  - Objective: how to be a wise steward over the provision of God.

## Part 1 – The Devastation of a Disobedient Steward

### Genesis 3:9

- The course and the fulfillment of our lives is controlled by our choices.
  - God asked man two questions when Adam decided to disobey God – “Adam where are you?”
  - The second question he asked to Cain – “What have you done?”
1. When I decide to disobey God what have I done to myself?
    - A. When I decide to disobey God, the judgment of God comes upon me immediately.
- Built in, inherent to, and inseparable from the laws of God is the judgment of God.

- B. When I decide to disobey God, I alter and sometimes destroy what God had planned for my life.**
  - **Do not confuse material wealth and natural success with fulfillment.**
- C. When I decide to disobey God, I alter and sometimes destroy my personal goals for my life (Psalm 37).**
- D. When I decide to disobey God, I suffer tremendous psychological damage.**

**2. Do you realize what you have done to your brother?**

- A. When I decide to disobey God, the judgment of God that is upon my life works a physical, mental, spiritual and financial hardship on other people.**
- B. When I decide to disobey God, my disobedience could alter or destroy the plan for my brother's life.**
