

# The Secret Place



**Psalm 91:1-2**

- “He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the Lord, He is my refuge and my fortress; My God, in Him I will trust.” (Psalm 91:1-2; NKJV).
  - We do not know who wrote this psalm, but Satan knew it and memorized it.
  - The most important part of a believer’s life is the part that only God sees, the “hidden life” of communion and worship.
  - Our world is full of sin and danger, diseases, injuries and disasters.
  - For generations, God’s people have turned to Psalm 91 for comfort and courage.
  - In Charles Dickens’ book “A Tale of Two Cities”, he states that “we live in the best of times and in the worst of times.”
- In this psalm there are four names of God that encourages us to trust Him.
    1. Elyon, “The Most High”: Possession
    2. Shaddai, “The Almighty”: Provision
    3. Jehovah, “The Lord”: Jehovah
    4. Elohim, “God the Creator”: Power
- God is our refuge and fortress (v. 2). A refuge is a shelter from trouble or danger. A fortress is a safe, secure place that is inaccessible to the enemy.
  - All that God is – His character and divine attributes – is available to us today.
