

# God is Omnipotent



**Psalm 147:5, Luke 1:37**

- The Study of the Attributes of God
  - The Attributes of God – the inherent characteristics of God.
  - The purpose: is to draw us closer to God.
  - The goal: To make us aware of God's great love for us.
  - Spiritual Principle: Authority, Unconditional love, Agreement, Faith, Grace
- Lessons Taught:
1. God is Faithful - Deuteronomy 7:1-9
    - Faithfulness points directly to God's divine nature and character. God is not trying to be faithful – He is faithful.
  2. Good is Good – Luke 18:19
    - God never has to add anything to Himself to make Him better or good. (Psalms 34:8, 33:5, 145:9, 119:68)
  3. God is Love - 1 John 4:7-8
    - When God says He is love, He is revealing to us that love is an essential part of His nature and character.
  4. God is Holy - Isaiah 6:1-3, Psalm 99:9
    - His Word is holy. His name is holy. His nature is holy. His Son and His Spirit are Holy. Everything about God as it relates to His nature and character is Holy.
  5. God Is Judge - Hebrews 10:30
    - God's wrath against sin arises, by necessity, out of His nature.
  6. God Is Sovereign - Isaiah 45:5-12
    - The Sovereignty of God is a theological term that refers to the unlimited power of God who has sovereign control over everything.

**7. God Is Gracious (Psalm 145:8-9)**

- God by His very nature is gracious toward all mankind.
- God Is Gracious toward mankind from the very beginning. (Genesis 1:1-3)

**8. God is Omnipresent (Psalm 139:7-12)**

- The word “Presence” is a common word, having to do with locality.
- The omnipresence of God means that He is present everywhere, in all places at all times.

**9. God Is Omniscient (Psalm 139:1-6)**

- The omniscience of God means that there is absolutely nothing God doesn't know; that no information system or set of data exists anywhere outside of God's knowledge.

## **God is Omnipotent Psalm 147:5, Luke 1:37**

- The Word of God revealed to us that our God is omniscient (He knows everything), God is omnipresent (He is in all places at all times) and today we will learn that our God is omnipotent.
- A. There is absolutely no one or nothing that exists or have been created that can compare the omnipotent power of our God.**
- The word “omni” means “all.”
  - The word “potent” means “powerful.”
  - Therefore, God is all-powerful.
  - God has unlimited power to reflect His divine glory and accomplish His sovereign will in the earth.
  - God uses His power to magnify His name, not to please or impress people, but to also display His glory in the earth and through the life of every true believer.

**B. God is infinite; therefore, His power is unlimited. God has the power to do anything He wants and when He wants if He so chooses.**

- 1. (Psalm 62:1-2, 11-12) – David teaches us that God is the only true refuge for the believer’s life. Only God can provide both salvation (deliverance) and refuge (shelter) all at the same time.**
  - (vs. 5-8) – David teaches us that all our confidence and all our strength comes from God who has all-power.
  - (vs. 11-12) – David teaches us that God is the source of power, love, and justice.
- 2. David teaches us that all power belongs to God.**
- 3. David teaches us that mercy belongs to the Lord.**
- 4. David teaches us that God will render to each one according to his work.**
- 5. The believer can rejoice and find rest in the God’s strength, love and faithfulness.**
  - Every believer can trust God’s power and strength to bring salvation (deliverance) from sin, death, and the grave. (Romans 1:16, 6:23, John 1:12-13, John 3:16-17, Titus 2:11-14, 1 Corinthians 15:54-58)
  - Every believer should have boldness and complete confidence in God’s power to provide refuge (shelter) and protection from all the attacks of the enemy. (Psalms 46:1, 34:19, 24:7-10, 91:1-16, Isaiah 43:1-2)

**C. God’s creative power. (Psalm 33:6-9)**

- 1. The Word of God teaches us that all that has been made or will ever be made was created by the power of God.**
- 2. Without God’s creative power – everything that exists in our world today (mankind, animals, sun, moon, stars, ocean, mountains, valleys, trees, plants, food, etc.) would be non-existent. (Genesis 1:1-31 2:7, Psalm 33:6-9)**
  - What does God’s creative power reveal?
    - 1. God is before all things. (Revelation 1:8, 21:6, John 1:1-4, 14, Colossians 1:17)**
    - 2. God is the Creator and founder of all things. (Genesis 1:1-2, 2:7, Psalm 89:11, Romans 1:20, Colossians 1:15-17)**

3. God is the Owner all things. (Psalms 24:1-2, 50:10-12, Exodus 19:5, Deuteronomy 10:14, Psalm 89:11)
4. God is the Sustainer of all things. (Psalm 104:5-6, Colossians 1:17)
5. God is the Judge of all things. (Psalm 75:7, 7:11, 2 Corinthians 5:10, 1 Peter 4:5, John 5:22)
6. God is the Rewarder of all things. (Hebrews 11:6, Colossians 3:23-25, 2 Corinthians 4:17-18, 1 Peter 1:6-8, Philippians 4:6-7, James 1:17, John 10:10, 14:1, 27, 2 Timothy 4:7-8)

**D. God's power is self-generating.**

1. God's omnipotence is connected to His rule and His will.
  - The only way that a person can be connected to His power is they must first be connected to Jesus Christ.
2. God never needs anything outside of Himself to sustain His power.
  - When God speaks things happen. When we speak God's word things happen. God's word has the power to change the situation, but most of all it will change us. (Hebrews 4:12, Psalms 119:11, 16, 105, 165-168, 1 Thessalonians 2:13)
3. God's power can never be depleted or drained because it is always self-sustained.
4. God's power is greater than our circumstances. (Jeremiah 32:17, 25-27)
