1 Cor. 3:16-17

- Stewardship is “God’s plan to fulfill my life.”
 - Fulfill – that which completes (Col. 2:9).
 - This principle is God’s plan to cause His will to produce an abundance.
 - Purpose: a character building, principle.
 - Goal: to super abound and meet the needs of others.
 - Objective: how to be a wise steward over the provision of God.

Stewardship Over Self

1 Cor. 3:16-17

- God created us to be able to contain all of the fullness of God in the spirit man.
- Stewardship Over Self:
 1. We belong to God.
 2. Every part of man was created to contain all the fullness of God to glorify God.
 3. We must give an account of every part of our trinity.
- I must take stewardship over my spirit.
 1. It is my responsibility to make sure that the spirit man is born of God’s Spirit.
 2. It is my responsibility to make sure that I am baptized in the Holy Spirit.
 - A. Baptism in the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8) – is when the Holy Spirit baptizes us to become an effective witness.

- B. There is a difference between being baptized of the Holy Spirit and water baptism (Acts. 1:5).**
- C. The baptism of the Holy Spirit is necessary with the evidence of speaking with other tongues (Acts 2:39).**
- D. The baptism of the Holy Spirit is not automatic with salvation; you must receive it (1 Cor. 2:12).**

3. It is my responsibility to be led by the Holy Spirit (Rom. 8:14).

A. A strong mind and a weak spirit are doomed to failure (Rom. 7:18).

B. A strong mind needs a power source.

- 1. The gifts of the Holy Spirit.**

- 2. God gave us spiritual armor (Eph. 6:10).**
