

Living Life to Glorify God



1 Corinthians 10:31

- Life is the single greatest gift every person and living creature received from God.
- Life is very short compared to eternity (Ps. 90:12).
- To number our days is more than just having a sense of mortality; it means valuing the time we do have by using it for eternal purposes.
- The real purpose of life is to glorify God!
- “When you don’t know the purpose of a thing, you will abuse the thing.” (Dr. Myles Munroe).
- Life: a sacred gift originating from God, intended for His glory and characterized by having a personal relationship with Him through Jesus Christ.
- Life: to know God, and to enjoy God, and to know Him personally.
- Glorify God: to give glory to God, when we recognize, admire, value, and extol His attributes and acts.
- Purpose: for us to discover what is the purpose and meaning of life and to live our lives to glorify God.
- Goal: to live an abundant life that only Jesus Christ gives (John 10:10).
- Objective: to teach us how to glorify God in our daily living.
- Spiritual principles: Stewardship, Grace, and Obedience
- Stewardship – God’s plan to fulfill my life.
- The top two questions that Christians ask: (1) What is my purpose in life? (2) How can I know God’s will for my life? Stewardship answers these questions.
- Grace – God’s plan to empower my life. Grace – the empowering presence of God, enabling us to do everything He has created us to do, and enabling us to be everything He called us to be.
- Obedience – God’s plan to reward my life. This principle teaches us how to live in the blessed state.

God is Glorified When We Bear Much Fruit John 15:8; Genesis 1:28

- **The Bible uses fruit to describe the produce of our lives. Fruit can be either good or bad (Matt. 7:18; Luke 6:43).**
- **To be “fruitful” means producing visible, godly results that honor God, encompassing both physical procreation and spiritual growth.**
- **In Genesis 1:28, God blessed man and woman.**
- **The greatest blessing we can receive is the blessings that come from our Heavenly Father (Eph. 1:3; Gen. 1:28).**
