

The Spiritual Gift of Prophecy



**1 Corinthians 12:7-11, 14:1-5, 1
Peter 16-21**

- The more we learn and understand about the Holy Spirit and His Gifts the more effective we can become in these last days.
- There are different spiritual gifts that have been distributed by the Holy Spirit to each member of the Body of Christ.
 1. Apostle Paul list Nine Spiritual Gifts in (1 Corinthians 12:7-10)
 2. Apostle Paul list Seven more Spiritual Gifts in (Romans 12:3-8)
- Purpose: To teach us the importance of each spiritual gifts and how the Holy Spirit uses each of them to benefit the Body of Christ as a whole.
- Goal: To mature us in our understanding of spiritual gifts so that our lives can be useful for the Kingdom of God.
- Spiritual Principles: Authority, Agreement, Stewardship, Obedience, Faith, Grace, Prayer
- Review Spiritual gifts in the (1st) Category: (1 Corinthians 12:7-10, Colossians 2:1-4)
 1. Revelation Gifts – “To Know.” (1 Corinthians 12:8, 10)
 - The Word of Wisdom
 - The Word of Knowledge
 - The Discerning of spirits
- We have discussed and examined the Spiritual Gifts in the (2nd) Category: (1 Corinthians 12:7-10, Romans 12:6-8)
 2. Demonstration Gifts or Power Gifts – “To Do.” (1 Corinthians 12:8-10)

- Today we will be discussing and examining the Spiritual Gifts in the (3rd) Category: (1 Corinthians 12:10-11, 1 Corinthians 14:1-40, 1 Thessalonians 5:19-22)
 3. Inspirational Gifts or Vocal Gifts – “To Speak.”
 - The Gift of Prophecy
 - The Gift of Tongues

- The Interpretation of Tongues
 - The Gift of Prophecy is still beneficial and needed within the Body of Christ. (Joel 2:28, Acts 2:16-18, 1 Thessalonians 5:19-21)
 1. God declared, “In the last days, I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh. Your sons and daughters shall prophesy...” (Joel 2:28, Acts 2:16-18)
 2. Paul declared, “Do not quench the Holy Spirit. Do not despise prophecies.” (1Thessalonians 5:19-20)
 - The word “quench” means to suppress, extinguish, subdue, put out, stifle or grieve the Holy Spirit.
 - The word “despise” means to hold contempt against, to detest, disdain, to regard as worthless, minimize and depreciate the purpose it serves. (vs. 20)
 3. Paul warns that all prophecy must be “tested”. (1 Thessalonians 5:21)
 - The word “test” means to prove, examine, and discern its genuineness toward the truth of God’s Word.
 - Statements About the Spiritual Gift of Prophecy. (1 Corinthians 12:10-11, 14:1-5)
 1. The Gift of Prophecy is the inspired utterance, prophetic utterance and revelations or speaking under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. (2Peter 1:19-21)
 2. The Gift of Prophecy is the supernatural manifestation of the Holy Spirit which enables a believer to speak an inspired word, message or prophetic revelation to the church (a gathering of believers) or to an individual.
 3. The Gift of Prophecy along with the other gifts, should never be viewed as a natural talent, human ability or something that can be obtained through education or special training.
 4. The Gift of Prophecy will always operate divinely or supernaturally by the manifestation of the Holy Spirit.

5. Prophecy in both the Old and New Testament was used to by God to communicate His message, His will, His heart in order to exhort, comfort, strengthen and warn His people. (Isaiah 9:6-7, Luke 1:26-35)
 - The word “prophecy” in the Old Testament means to speak (or sing) by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.
 - The word “prophecy” in the New Testament means to foretell events, divine communication, inspired message, speak under inspiration, and exercise the prophetic office.
 6. The Gift of Prophecy is speaking forth the mind, will and counsel of God or to be His spokesman.
 7. The Gift of Prophecy includes both predictions and proclamations in the Bible.
 - Foretelling – means predicting or declaring future events before they happen through divine inspiration and spiritual guidance by the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit will give some believers a glimpse into future events in order to prepare God’s people for what is to come.
 - Forthtelling – means proclaiming or declaring God’s will in order to exhort, strengthen, and encourage His people. The God’s message may also come to expose, warn and judge the hearts of those who have turn away from the truth of His Word.
 8. The Gift of Prophecy is a functioning gift that is distributed by the Holy Spirit to believers, but that doesn’t mean they have been called to the office of a Prophet.
 9. The Gift of Prophecy is used by the Holy Spirit to serve a specific purpose and benefit to the church (gathering of believers) and individuals. (1 Corinthians 14:3)
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- 1) To Edify or Edification means to build up and strengthen believers in their faith in Jesus Christ. (Ephesians 4:29)
 - 2) To Exhort or Exhortation means to encourage, admonish, comfort, motivate, and stir up believers to remain faithful and steadfast to the message and ministry work of Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 15:58, Hebrews 3:12-15)

3) To Comfort means to give comfort, strength, hope, to cheer up or lift up a believer that is discouraged, under intense stress, pressure, or grief to not give up and continue to trust in God and His Word. (Proverbs 3:5-7, Galatians 6:9-10, Romans 8:28)

- Paul confronts the issue about Love and Spiritual Gifts. (1 Corinthians 14:1)
- Paul gives us a follow-up from the previous Chapter 13, which is known as the “Love Chapter”. This was an ongoing issue in this church and Apostle Paul addresses it in his letter to them. (1 Corinthians 14:1)

○ Paul shares Three important things with the Believers in Corinth. (1 Corinthians 14:1)

1. To Eagerly “follow or pursue” love. (vs. 1)

- The word “follow” means to pursue after, ensue, press forward, persist, continue on without hesitation until love reach and serve God’s eternal purpose in the hearts of others.

2. To Earnestly “desire” spiritual gifts. (vs. 1)

- The word “desire” means to covet earnestly, earnest seeking, be zealous, ambitious for and a passionate longing for.

3. To Especially “prophecy”. (vs. 1)

- The words “may prophecy” means to foretell events, speak divinely, speak under inspiration, and to exercise the prophetic office.

○ Paul gives a clear message to these believers that the purpose and motivation behind each desired spiritual gift must be love. (vs. 1)

1. When God’s love continually flows through us and is earnestly pursued by us as believers, the utilization of that spiritual gift will serve God’s eternal purpose both within and outside the church.

2. Spiritual gifts are to be desired, but not pursued more than love.

3. The danger when gifts are pursued and prioritized first and not love:

- It can lead to the improper use and misunderstanding of that gift.
- Self-exaltation and selfish behaviors.
- Manipulation and abuse.
- Envy and Jealousy.

- **Superiority complex and super-spirituality (religious).**
